It reflects our commitment to continue Spirit-led worship and music. It reflects our commitment to study and fellowship together, and to spread the Good News of God's love and grace into the community.

This Sunday, November 13, is Commitment Sunday during which time we will offer and dedicate our pledges of time and money for 2023. We ask you to prayerfully consider committing your resources of time, talent and finances to this community of faith. Every gift makes a difference. Every gift matters. We ask you to prayerfully consider increasing your pledge for 2023 over and above your 2022 pledge to reflect the exciting days ahead, as we live into God's call for the next chapter of our life together at the Presbyterian Church of Okemos.
