Adult Education: The Rev. Fran Lane-Lawrence will be sharing information about how at the denominational level the PC(USA) is called to be repairers of the breaches created by systemic racism. Rev. Lane-Lawrence served on the PC(USA)'s Special Committee on Racism, Truth, and Reconciliation, which presented a report and made recommendations to the General Assembly in 2022. She has recently been appointed to serve on a special committee exploring and exposing where white supremacy is "embedded institutionally and foundationally" in the PC(USA), as well as its governing documents.
