#### **MUSIC NOTES**

J.S. Bach (1685-1750) is regarded by many as the greatest composer in the history of Western music. Bach lived and worked in the shadow of Martin Luther where, as one writer described it "Luther was a great deal more compelling than gravity."

Guided by his Lutheran convictions, Bach devoted his life to creating music to the glory of God. At the end of his compositions, both sacred and some secular, Bach inscribed the letters "S.D.G."(Soli Deo Gloria- To God Alone, the glory). The phrase has since become one of the five solas associated with the Reformation, sola scriptura (scripture alone), Solis Christa (Christ alone), sola fide (faith alone), sola gratia (grace alone), and soli Deo gloria (glory to God alone). Each sola represents a key belief in the Protestant tradition that is distinctive from the doctrines of the Catholic Church.
