Paper Products – Deforestation

According to a report by **World Watch Magazine**, almost **10%** of the world's deforestation is attributed to toilet paper production¹. Toilet paper is made from trees, and the logging industry in Canada, which is one of the most climate-critical ecosystems on the planet, is responsible for degrading over a million acres of this forest every year, in part to feed U.S. demand for toilet paper². The boreal forest is the most carbon-dense, intact forest left on the planet, locking up in its soils and trees twice as much carbon as the world's oil reserves².

It is important to note that the percentage of deforestation caused by toilet paper production varies depending on the source. <u>According to the **Natural Resource**</u> **Defense Council**, toilet paper production alone is responsible for **15%** of deforestation³.

The impact of deforestation is a double whammy – every time a tree is taken down we lose the carbon capturing potential of that tree; plus all the carbon that has been captured by that tree over the years is released into the environment.

What is PCO doing with respect to the deforestation impact?

Answer: PCO is purchasing different types of recycled paper products:

Prior – Angel Soft 36,000 total sheets Cost = \$82.19
Now – Ever Spring (Target) 36,000 total sheets Cost = \$66.95
