Frost is active as an organ recitalist and workshop clinician. He is a member of the Presbyterian Association of Musicians (PAM) and The Hymn Society in the United States and Canada where he is President. He was a member of the Presbyterian Committee on Congregational Song (PCOCS) which developed *Glory to God*, the Presbyterian Hymnal.
