


Service for the Lord's Day August 17, 2025

Camino Pilgrimage

This week, Pastor Kristin Stroble and Rebecca Mattern will share insights and stories from the pilgrimage they made together on the Camino Frances this summer.

The Camino de Santiago, also known as the Way of St. James, is a network of ancient pilgrimage routes that lead to the cathedral of Santiago de Compostela in northwest Spain. These routes converge on the city, which is believed to be the final resting place of the Apostle James.

The pilgrimage dates back to the 9th century, with evidence of routes used by early pilgrims. Many pilgrims find the experience profoundly personal and transformative, often seeking a sense of peace, reflection, or connection with nature. The Camino de Santiago is primarily a Christian pilgrimage, though it also attracts walkers for recreational, spiritual, or personal reasons.

Kind and compassionate God, thank you for these beloved children of God. They are worthy of kindness and care, and precious to our community. Today, we bless and send these young people and grown-ups into a world where kindness isn't always the easiest path - where meanness and cruelty can show up without warning.

But we send them with confidence,

knowing they carry the courage to choose kindness anyway.

Give them the courage and the compassion to show kindness to others in the classroom, at the lunch table,

on the playground, in the office,

in the group chat, on social media,

on the athletic team, in the extracurricular club,

in their committees, and anywhere kindness is lacking.

to take protective action to create safer spaces.

And when we fail to be kind, inspire us to repent, apologize, forgive, and try again.

We pray all these things in the name of the one who is friend to the friendless and sibling to the lonely. Amen.
