One: God calls us to come in worship and praise. And when we feel on top of things in our life and feel invincible, with all the world at our feet, this is an easy task.

All: It is much harder when reality overshadows us and we are suddenly fragile, weak and vulnerable. It is then that we rediscover that your generous favor, grace and mercy is still readily available to us, and the world's so-called security means very little to us.

One: Generous God, in your gracious compassion, hear our sincere prayers, and have mercy.

All: We come to you confessing our doubts and fears, our anxieties and our insecurity. Help us to understand that, even in our weaknesses and brokenness, we are not lost to you. Forgive us, when we are sure “our” way is the only way to be successful. In our ambitious pride, we have often ignored the people whom you have sent to us to enliven and challenge us - the

people who have different insights about love and life, and who could enrich us spiritually and even socially.
