**Preparation:** The triple spiral (or triskele) has a profound historical connection to the Christian Trinity. While the triple spiral pattern originated thousands of years ago in Neolithic and Pagan Celtic art, early Christian missionaries in Ireland and Britain adopted the symbol because of how the paths are drawn. Three-in-One Unity: The symbol consists of three distinct loops or spirals, yet they are all formed from one single, continuous, unbroken line. This mirrors the Christian belief in one singular Godhead comprised of three distinct co-equal persons. This image is from a photo Pastor Lisa took from the ruins of St. Cavan's Church (Irish: Teampall Chaomháin) built in the 10th century on the Irish island Inisheer.
